Deactivating a Facebook Account

1.	Log into the Facebook account you want to deactivate	
2.	In the upper right hand corner click on “Account”	
3.	In the drop down screen click on “account settings”	
4.	If you are attempting to deactivate your child’s account, remember that they can reactivate it at anytime by simply entering the password. In order to prevent this, you will have to change the password to something that they do not know. To do this, click on the word “change” on the Password line	
5.	Enter the password you used to log-in to the account and then choose a password your child will not know. Once that is done, log out of Facebook and log back in. Go to account settings as is outlined above. Click on the word “deactivate” at the bottom of the screen	
6.	Follow the onscreen instructions. Be sure to follow all of the instructions because it will ask you to confirm multiple times. If your child attempts to reactivate the account, they will not have the correct password (because you changed it) and will not be able to update the account. However, you may have to also change the e-mail address the account is associated with because the new password can be sent to that address as well so I would recommend changing the e-mail address as well as the password before deleting the account. This can be done from the account settings page as well
